US Soccer Mandated Structure Changes to Youth Soccer

Youth Soccer Governing Body Structure

- The US Soccer Federation is the governing body for the sport of soccer in the United States.
- The new mandates apply to all national youth soccer organizations who are members of US Soccer, USYSA (aka CYSA), US Club Soccer and AYSO.
- Our league, Nor Cal Premier, National Premier League (aka NPL) and Nor Cal State Cup are all governed by US Club Soccer, who in turn is governed by US Soccer Federation.

BIRTH-YEAR REGISTRATION

Birth-year registration calendars will now align with the start of the calendar year and run from January to December, rather than August to July as it had previously. Birth-year registration applies to all player age groups and not just players age 12 and younger.

The initiative will align registration with the international standard, as well as US Soccer Youth National team programming as well as programs such as ID2, PDP and ODP who are all already on a calendar year format.

NEW PLAYER / TEAM FORMATS

The new player and team size standards are focused at players from the U-6 to U-12 age groups. This new environment will allow players a better opportunity to develop their on-the-ball skills as well as increase their soccer intelligence

The number of players on the pitch will increase in size from 4v4 to 7v7 to 9v9 as players move up in age, until they reach the U-13 age group and begin to play full 11v11 matches.

The core objectives behind the small sided standards are as follows:

- Fewer players on the field means more touches on the ball and increased touches translates to more individual skill.
- Players who are more skilled may become more confident and comfortable when in possession of the ball.
- The ratio of players to field size is designed to assist players with making the right kind of decisions and improving awareness.
- This approach builds on itself as players get older and start playing with more players on bigger fields.
- And as players get older, the building block approach also allows them to better integrate into a team model where they develop partnerships with the other players that make up the team.

Overall, the standards provide for an age-appropriate environment for players to achieve the objectives listed above

What to expect for the 2016 season

Tryouts

- U8-U11 January 29-Feb 6 -2016
 - ➤ These tryouts will be for players with birthdates in 2008, 2007, 2006 and 2005
- U12-U13 February 19-27 2016
 - > These tryouts will be for players with birthdates in 2004 and 2003
- U14 Tryouts are not yet set as some of the 2002 age group will be still playing.

How will teams be formed?

Teams will be formed in conformance with the new US Soccer Federation mandates and in the same manner we have always conducted tryouts.

Can my child play up an age group?

Placer United has always had a policy that players must tryout in their own age group. If the coach and/or Director believe it is in the best interest of the players development to have them play up, that is what will be offered to the player. However, players will not be allowed to play up unless it is a benefit to the player's development and they will have a meaningful impact on the older team.
